

AFTERSCHOOL CLUBS OVERVIEW



Stories and Rhymes Club

Stories and Rhymes Club exposes the children to a wide range of traditional stories and rhymes. The children learn new words and how to express themselves. We also engage the children in role-play activities, as this helps /in building their confidence.



Ballet Club

Ballet helps children develop co-ordination of mind and body. It nurtures their ability to focus and maintain intense concentration.



Bible Club

Bible Club is set to help children cultivate their spiritual interest in God and build a strong moral foundation. Through lesson presentations, small group discussions, songs, and drama, the children will learn simple truths about God and how to live as God's children in the world.



Creative Art Club

Children naturally love art. We learn to think creatively, observe, describe, interpret, and express feelings with different media of art.



French Club

Coding/Robotics Club explores a limitless world of coding and robotics through coding, creative activities, online blend, self-paced and project-based learning to build foundational skills in coding, animation and robotics.



Dance Club

The Dance Club is designed to help the children find and nurture their creative flair. With classes that use the elements of the performing arts (dance, drama and music), the children will be able to move to beat, create movement, and act out multiple characters in dance drama.



Model UN

Model UN helps students to develop public speaking, writing and research skills.

In addition, they often provide the first entry point into international affairs and introduce students to the wide range of peace and security, human rights, development and rule of law issues that are on the UN agenda.



Clarinet

The Woodwind section of the Orchestra has a quite fascinating member - the Clarinet. The Clarinet club affords the players the ability to build on the existing Recorder playing skills, acquire top-notch proficiency and play amidst a dynamic Group of learners.



Saxophone

The Saxophone Club teaches the rudiments of music, sight reading, the variety of learning the Soprano, Alto, Tenor and Hybrid saxophones and also affords the learners the environment of practicing and playing in an ensemble of like-minded wind players.



Guitar

The Guitar Club affords the learners the ability to Sight Read and acquire the required skills in playing the Electric Guitar, Bass Guitar and Acoustic Guitar.



Trumpet

The Trumpet club gives room and opportunity for the learner to acquire the required dexterity and aural skill needed to play both by rote and by note.



Choir

The Choir is designed to give each student a well-rounded and enriched music education. Students will learn things like proper vocal technique, music terminology, general music theory, confidence in performing, as well as many other musically related topics.



The Young Authors Club is a creative writing programme that nurtures imagination, creativity, and self-expression. Pupils learn essential writing skills, including storytelling, character development, plot building, editing, and publishing. Throughout the school session, each member is guided in creating an original manuscript from idea to finished book. The programme also strengthens reading, communication, critical thinking, and confidence. Every participating pupil has the opportunity to become a published young author. The school session concludes with a Young Authors Book Launch and Author Celebration, where pupils proudly showcase their published books. Life Skills

In the Life Skills Club, we explore a range of practical skills essential for everyday life. Students learn how to sew buttons, fold clothes neatly, knot ties, iron safely and become more independent. In addition to mastering these fundamental tasks, they also experiment with baking and cooking simple meals.

Creativity is encouraged through craft activities such as book wrapping and paper flower making. Throughout the term, emphasis is placed on the value of consistent practice in achieving confidence and proficiency in life skills.



Karate

Karate is a traditional martial art. The term "karate" translates to "empty hand," reflecting its focus on unarmed combat techniques.

It emphasizes striking with punches, kicks, knee strikes, and elbow strikes, along with blocking techniques, forms (katas), and sparring (kumite).

Karate not only serves as a means of self-defense but also promotes discipline, respect, and personal development.



Press Club

The Press club aims to build public speaking skills for all its members. Students in the club are drilled in the following skills; news reporting, public speaking, publishing, producing media, and creative writing skills.

Every member of the club is guided and encouraged to present to an audience and experience reading the news to the school community.
